Minutes of meeting 1st May 2025

2) Adoption of Minutes of Previous Meeting

3) Matters Arising

Handvperson help

<u>Volunteering Matters</u> is a charity that supports older and disabled people with 'handyperson' jobs around the house (e.g. building furniture, changing light bulbs, unblocking sinks, etc). The charity is also looking for volunteers - jobs are matched based on skills and interests. Members of BCC suggested that they get in touch with the Thursday lunch club, the local churches and the repair cafe to raise awareness for new customers and volunteers.

6) Police Report

Anti-social behaviour

A resident received a threatening phone call by a person known to them. Enquiries are ongoing to trace the person responsible.

Vandalism

A resident had an unknown item thrown at their kitchen window causing it to crack. No further lines of enquiry exist and this remains undetected.

Road Traffic

The driver of a lorry was issued with a fixed penalty notice for careless driving after they emerged from a junction into the path of another vehicle narrowly avoiding a collision.

Theft

A theft has been recorded after a parcel left on the doorstep of the victim's home address was taken. No further lines of enquiry and this remains undetected.

A theft has been recorded after a quantity of drystone wall stones were taken from a wall of a property in the village. No further lines of enquiry exist and this remains undetected.

Assault

A minor assault has been recorded after a youth football match at the high school. Following the match a volunteer referee was struck with a bag that was thrown at him by a member of the opposing team. Enquiries are ongoing to trace the person responsible.

Fraud talk

Last year, the community policing team organised and ran a talk at the bowling club to discuss the dangers of fraud. PC McCammon has suggested running a similar session again; BCC support and welcome this suggestion.

The full police report is available on the Balfron Community Council website and includes reports for the surrounding villages.

7) Elected Councillor's report

Cllr Fraser updated the meeting. Stirling and Clackmannanshire Health and Social Care Partnership is the only integrated health board in Scotland that is made up of two councils. The board currently cannot agree a budget as there is a £8 million overspend from 2024/25 and no agreement between councils as to how this should be managed.

Stirling Council is considering a visitor levy. Money generated would come directly to Stirling Council and be used to promote the area as a visitor attraction or for community benefit (e.g. improving transport). This is due to be agreed in December 2025 and would come into effect in 2027. There is currently a consultation period to collect residents' feedback. Other points raised included that Stirling Council have received a proposal for a community bus from Balfron High School and that the council currently has a number of buildings up for sale (e.g. the Balfron Registry Office).

8) Treasurer report

The accounts have been sent to the auditor for the annual audit. Insurance costs have been sent to the relevant community groups. The admin grant is due to be submitted by the end of July.

9) Planning report

One application was submitted in the last month. The proposal is to change the use from farm building (Dalfoil Farm, Balfron, G63 0QD) to residential flats including the upgrade of the existing access and track. BCC has no comments or concerns on this proposal.

10) Chair's report

Last month, a resident contacted the BCC about an ongoing issue with parked cars on Hillhead Brae that causes visibility and access issues. Stirling Council will extend the double yellow lines to improve accessibility and safety.

A resident contacted BCC about the closure and sale of the hardware store, suggesting that it could be bought as a community asset to maintain its current purpose. This would require significant funds and investment that BCC could not currently undertake, but would support community initiatives to do this.

A resident was in touch about organising a community event in memory of Lachlan Cameron, such as a community litter picking day. BCC would be happy to support this and discussed possible dates (likely August). Cllr Fraser suggested that Stirling Council could provide the litter pickers, bin/recycling bags and collect the rubbish. BCC are happy to support this and contact the council.
